Overview

The aim of this course is to help organisations to establish their own in-house capabilities to develop and maintain effective collaborative working. Learning Objectives

This course is designed to equip learners with an appreciation of how consistent and predictable results can be more effectively and efficiently delivered by the application of ISO 44001. The course will also identify the benefits of applying ISO44001 to both internal and external collaborative relationships.

This course covers the following learning objectives:

- Explain the scope and applicability of the standard
- Explain the benefits of the application of the standard
- Explain the eight-stage operational framework specified in the standard and the link to the High-Level Structure (HLS)
- Describe the intent of the standards requirements
- Describe the common themes throughout the standard
- Understand why relationships are important in delivering business strategy
- Understand the value of a pan-industry framework to enhance engagement and provide a benchmark for collaborative capability
- Be able to link collaborative working to organisational objectives and constraints to promote both effective engagement and risk management
- Be able to assess an organisation's internal capability as a prerequisite to external engagement
- Be able to develop processes for the selection of partners
- Understand how to facilitate the development of an appropriate delivery model and contracting arrangements for organisations seeking to engage partners in collaborative relationships
- Understand the importance of continuous improvement, innovation and value creation to develop the relationship to its fullest extent
- Appreciate the importance of effective measurement and monitoring of performance and the relationship
- Understand the critical need to define the exit strategy to facilitate controlled disengagement

Delivery

This is a full 4-day residential course, delivered entirely in person, and will include professional development feedback.

The first two days of the course covers the content, and the third day is for the exam. This exam will be monitored by Warwick University.

Each day runs from 9am to 5:00pm and include some evening professional feedback sessions and study groups.

Assessment

The final exam is optional but successful completion of it is required for attribution of the post nominals MICW.

On successful completion of the course (and a pass in the exam) participants become eligible to be considered for full membership of the Institute for Collaborative Working globally including use of the post nominals MICW.

Cost

The cost of the course is **\$4000 (excluding GST)** and includes accommodation and meals.
